## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Home-

## SEC. 2. INFORMATION ON DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SE CURITY HEADQUARTERS CONSOLIDATION PROJECT.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the 5 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in coordination with the Administrator, shall submit to the appro-6 7 priate committees of Congress information on the imple-8 mentation of the enhanced plan for the Department head-9 quarters consolidation project within the National Capital 10 Region, approved by the Office of Management and Budg-11 et and included in the budget of the President for fiscal 12 year 2016 (as submitted to Congress under section 13 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code), that includes the following: 14

15 (1) A proposed occupancy plan for the consoli-16 dation project that includes specific information 17 about which Department-wide operations, component 18 operations, and support offices will be located at the 19 site, the aggregate number of full time equivalent 20 employees projected to occupy the site, the seat-to-21 staff ratio at the site, and schedule estimates for mi-22 grating operations to the site.

(2) A comprehensive assessment of the difference between the current real property and facilities needed by the Department in the National Capital Region in order to carry out the mission of the

Department and the future needs of the Depart ment.

3 (3) A current plan for construction of the head4 quarters consolidation at the St. Elizabeths campus
5 that includes—

6 (A) the estimated costs and schedule for 7 the current plan, which shall conform to rel-8 evant Federal guidance for cost and schedule 9 estimates, consistent with the recommendation 10 of the Government Accountability Office in the 11 September 2014 report entitled "Federal Real 12 Property: DHS and GSA Need to Strengthen 13 the Management of DHS Headquarters Con-14 solidation" (GAO-14-648); and

(B) any estimated cost savings associated
with reducing the scope of the consolidation
project and increasing the use of existing capacity developed under the project.

(4) A current plan for the leased portfolio of
the Department in the National Capital Region that
includes—

(A) an end-state vision that identifies
which Department-wide operations, component
operations, and support offices do not migrate

1	to the St. Elizabeths campus and continue to
2	operate at a property in the leased portfolio;
3	(B) for each year until the consolidation
4	project is completed, the number of full-time
5	equivalent employees who are expected to oper-
6	ate at each property, component, or office;
7	(C) the anticipated total rentable square
8	feet leased per year during the period beginning
9	on the date of enactment of this Act and ending
10	on the date on which the consolidation project
11	is completed; and
12	(D) timing and anticipated lease terms for
13	leased space under the plan referred to in para-
14	graph $(3)$ .
15	(5) An analysis that identifies the costs and
16	benefits of leasing and construction alternatives for
17	the remainder of the consolidation project that in-
18	cludes—
19	(A) a comparison of the long-term cost
20	that would result from leasing as compared to
21	consolidating functions on Government-owned
22	space; and
23	(B) the identification of any cost impacts
24	in terms of premiums for short-term lease ex-
25	tensions or holdovers due to the uncertainty of

1	funding for, or delays in, completing construc-
2	tion required for the consolidation.
3	(b) Comptroller General Review.—
4	(1) REVIEW REQUIRED.—The Comptroller Gen-
5	eral of the United States shall review the cost and
6	schedule estimates submitted under subsection (a) to
7	evaluate the quality and reliability of the estimates.
8	(2) Assessment.—Not later than 90 days
9	after the submittal of the cost and schedule esti-
10	mates under subsection (a), the Comptroller General
11	shall report to the appropriate congressional commit-
12	tees on the results of the review required under
13	paragraph (1).
14	(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:
15	(1) The term "Administrator" means the Ad-
16	ministrator of General Services.
17	(2) The term "appropriate committees of Con-
18	gress" means the Committee on Homeland Security
19	and the Committee on Transportation and Infra-
20	structure of the House of Representatives and the
21	Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
22	Affairs of the Senate.
23	(3) The term "Department" means the Depart-
24	ment of Homeland Security.

1	(4) The term "National Capital Region" has
2	the meaning given the term under section $2674(f)(2)$
3	of title 10, United States Code.
4	(5) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary
5	of Homeland Security.
