2 **SEC. ____ . OPM DATA BREACH DAMAGE ASSESSMENT.**

3 (a) ASSESSMENT.—The Secretary of Homeland Security and the Director of National Intelligence shall jointly,
4 rity and the Director of National Intelligence shall jointly,
5 and in coordination with the head of each appropriate
6 agency, conduct an ongoing damage and risk assessment
7 relating to the data breaches at the Office of Personnel
8 Management (referred to in this section as the “OPM data
9 breach”).

10 (b) REPORTS.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
2 after the date of enactment of this Act, and once not
3 later than 180 days thereafter, the Director of Na-
4 tional Intelligence shall submit to Congress a report
5 on the assessment conducted under subsection (a).

6 (2) CONTENTS.—Each report submitted under
7 this subsection shall include—

8 (A) updates on the extent to which Federal
9 data was compromised, exfiltrated, or manipu-
10 lated by the same entity that caused the OPM
11 data breach;

12 (B) analysis of the impact of the OPM
13 data breach on national security; and

14 (C) analysis of whether any information
15 accessed through the OPM data breach has
16 been released or deployed, whether publicly or
17 privately.

18 (3) UNCLASSIFIED FORM.—Each report sub-
19 mitted under this subsection shall be in unclassified
20 form, but may include a classified annex.
