Dear Commissioner Gandhi:

Since 2021, federal law enforcement has been reportedly “prob[ing] a series of multimillion dollar fraud schemes” that were occurring in Minnesota through taxpayer funded welfare programs.¹ To date, the Department of Justice (DOJ) has charged more than 70 individuals in connection with a network of fraudulent welfare schemes operating in Minnesota.² According to the then First Assistant U.S. Attorney for Minnesota, these fraudulent schemes may have cost taxpayers \$9 billion or more since 2018.³ Subsequent public reporting has revealed even more fraud that has occurred under the Minnesota Department of Human Services’ (DHS) watch, spanning housing programs, day care centers, and initiatives intended to support children with autism.⁴ Given the pervasiveness of fraud in your state, it is past time for Minnesota to answer for its apparent failure to safeguard taxpayer dollars.

For years, the Minnesota State Legislature’s Office of the Legislative Auditor (OLA) repeatedly warned that DHS was failing to meet its oversight obligations, including insufficient inspection, audit, and enforcement activities related to program integrity. In 2019, OLA found

that Minnesota's Child Care Assistance Program lacked sufficient program-integrity controls, citing insufficient licensing oversight and a lack of coordinated investigative efforts.⁵ A June 2024 OLA review further identified severe deficiencies in fraud controls in the "Feeding Our Future" program.⁶ One public report noted that this fraudulent scheme was "not merely the result of sophisticated criminals, but a systemic failure inside state agencies tasked with oversight."⁷ Accordingly, a clear accounting of how Minnesota's program-integrity controls failed is required.

On October 25, 2025, only weeks after DOJ publicly announced indictments related to large-scale fraud schemes, Governor Walz finally paused payments to, and ordered a third-party audit of billing for, 14 high-risk Medicaid services.⁸

Public awareness of this widespread fraud intensified when investigative journalist Nick Shirley posted a YouTube video alleging that DHS-administered programs paid approximately \$111 million to fraudulent entities claiming to provide child care and health care services.⁹ At the very least, routine DHS oversight should have identified obvious program-integrity red flags at child care centers receiving unusually large payments relative to their licensed capacity.

Enclosed is a list that was provided to my office of over 70 additional examples of child care businesses in Minnesota that received over \$1 million in annual payments from the state in 2024 (see Attachment A).¹⁰ Given DHS's lack of effective oversight, the public deserves to know the extent to which these facilities may be misusing taxpayer funds.¹¹

To better understand the state of Minnesota's failure to identify and halt fraudulent schemes that have cost the taxpayers billions of dollars, please provide the following information

by February 17, 2026. Unless otherwise stated, the period of time for this request shall be January 1, 2020, to present.

1. All records¹² referring or relating to actual or suspected fraud, abuse, improper billing, or enforcement actions involving childcare assistance programs and Medicaid services administered by DHS including but not limited to:
 - a. All communications to or from the following individuals:
 - i. DHS Commissioner Jodi Harpstead;
 - ii. former DHS Commissioner Tony Lourey;
 - iii. DHS Acting Commissioner Shireen Gandhi;
 - iv. former DHS CFO Dan Greeman;
 - v. former Housing Stabilization program manager Eric Grumdahl;
 - vi. former Inspector General Carolyn Ham; and
 - vii. Kulani Moti.
2. Provide a complete list of all entities that received payment, reimbursement, or any other monies from the Early Intensive Developmental and Behavioral Intervention program, the Housing Stabilization Services program, or the Federal Child Nutrition Program, to include:
 - a. The name of the entity;
 - b. The total amount the entity received from each of the above listed programs;
 - c. The name(s) of the beneficial owners of any entity that received funds from any of the above listed programs;
 - d. The names and titles of the individuals who conducted inspections, audits, payment reviews, or compliance checks of each entity and the names and titles of the individuals that received any report following the inspections;
 - e. The dates of when each entity was inspected, audited, or received a payment review or compliance check;
 - f. Whether any employee or representative of the entities received prior notification of an inspection, audit, payment review, or compliance check and, if so, by whom and how far in advance; and
 - g. Any final product or report created following an inspection, audit, payment review, or compliance check of each entity.
3. All records referring or relating to the decision to pause the 14 Medicaid service categories identified as high-risk in Governor Walz's October 25, 2025 Order, including but not limited to:
 - a. All communications between DHS and the Governor's office;
 - b. All communications with any federal agency or nongovernmental entity; and
 - c. Any memorandum, briefing materials, or risk assessments.

4. For each of the 14 Medicaid service categories identified as high-risk in Governor Walz's October 25, 2025 Order, provide a list of all complaints, fraud reports, or hotline tips, including any complaints or reports by DHS employees, received for each service category, including an explanation of the final disposition of any such complaint, report, or tip.
5. For each of the 14 Medicaid service categories identified as high-risk in Governor Walz's October 25, 2025 Order, provide the following information for each calendar year:
 - a. Total annual program expenditures;
 - b. The total number of unique recipients served;
 - c. The total number of enrolled providers receiving payment under each service category;
 - d. The name or identity of each provider who received payments from each service category, as well as the percent increase year-over-year in payments for each provider;
 - e. Whether the provider was ever suspended, terminated, or otherwise had payment reduced for suspected fraud or noncompliance, including the year in which any such action was taken and the current status of the provider; and
 - f. Any referrals or complaints submitted to state or federal law enforcement entities for suspected fraud, including the date any such referral or complaint was made and the final disposition.
6. With respect to each childcare provider identified in Attachment A below, provide the following information:
 - a. The total amount of public assistance payments received by the provider for each calendar year;
 - b. Whether DHS conducted any inspections, audits, payment reviews, or compliance checks of the provider during that period, including the date and nature of each action;
 - c. The names and titles of the individuals who conducted inspections, audits, payment reviews, or compliance checks of each entity and the names and titles of the individuals that received any report following the inspections;
 - d. Whether any employee or representative of the entities received prior notification of an inspection, audit, payment review, or compliance check and, if so, by whom and how far in advance;
 - e. Any final product or report created following an inspection, audit, payment review, or compliance check of each entity;
 - f. Whether DHS identified any concerns, red flags, or indicators of potential fraud or noncompliance associated with the provider, and if so, describe those concerns;
 - g. What enforcement actions, if any, DHS took in response to those concerns, including but not limited to payment suspensions or referrals to law enforcement; and
 - h. If DHS took no action with respect to a provider despite receiving substantial public funds, explain the basis for that decision and identify the DHS official(s) responsible.

7. All records referring or relating to PFM Consulting Group Inc.'s review of the Minnesota Family Investment Program Child Care Assistance Program, including but not limited to draft reports, communications with PFM employees, and internal DHS communications about the report's findings.¹³
8. All records referring or relating to the Minnesota Minority Childcare Association (MMCA), including but not limited to all communications between DHS and representatives of MMCA.

I expect you to be completely transparent and responsive to my office; however, I will not hesitate to use compulsory process if I suspect any attempt to delay or obstruct my efforts.
